905 people die in winter home fires each year.

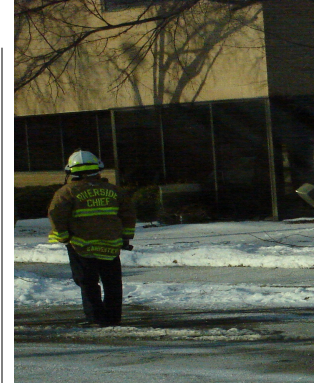
\$2,091,000,000 in property loss occurs from winter home fires.

department drawstring bag. The Fire Department is extremely grateful to our sponsors and volunteers. Their involvement allows us to host this fun community event.



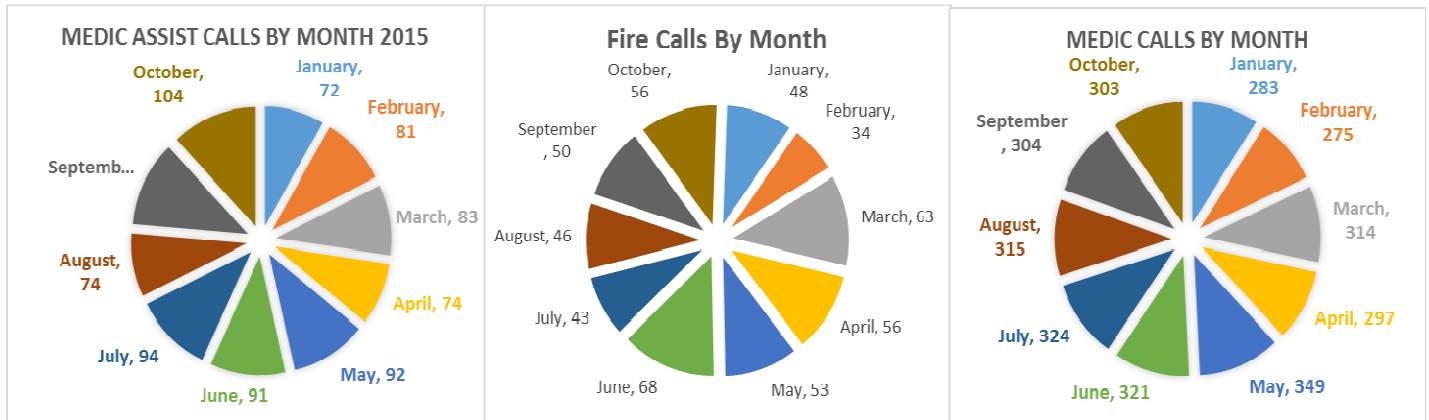
